

As I am involved in the IT industry, I am happy to receive information in almost any format; I am sure many Brethren wish things might be made simpler, and in the case of mobile phone users; simpler means smaller documents that are easy to access and process (archive etc).

The single item affecting the size of a document is imagery (photos, logos, and graphics). As an exercise I opened one of the logos from an email in a basic image editor from Adobe, halved the height and width, saved the file as a .png and the file is now 72.6KB, whereas the original image weighed in at 1,160kb (The file size could also be shrunk using FREE on-line software to 285kb at [pixlr.com](http://pixlr.com) - not quite as efficient as Adobe, but cost effective and a quarter of the original size!). The test document was originally 1.3mb and is now under 200kb and looks identical to the original – it's just more efficient to transmit and archive.

It should also be noted that there are security issues of attaching files to emails. MS Word and Adobe PDF can both harbour viruses. While most senders are conscientious and have antivirus software installed on their desktop PCs and Laptops; is your/their phone similarly protected?

Why not send run of the mill communications by simply typing a message into an email, after all that's what email apps were designed for?

## Royal Order of Scotland

### Province Grand Lodge of Inverness and the Highlands

Following on from the Installation of the Provincial Grand Master on 10 June 2023 (August Patter, pp33-35), the Royal Order, under the organisation of Bro John Baillie, Provincial Grand Steward, raised the superb sum of £1000 from a raffle and auction, to be donated to Moray Firth Radio's Cash for Kids. The donation will be made in the first week of November, too late for photos for this edition of the Patter, so these will follow along.

The Royal Order of Scotland is one of the most historic Orders within Freemasonry and can trace its regal roots back 700 years. That royal connection originates with Robert the Bruce, who is said to have conferred knighthoods on a group of Freemasons who assisted him in his victory over the English at the Battle of Bannockburn in 1314. Those knights are recognised as the first members of the Royal Order of Scotland.

Today, the Headquarters of the Royal Order of Scotland is in Edinburgh, as it has been for over 250 years. The Grand Lodge is unusual as it is the only Grand Lodge to work the ceremonials and to admit new members itself.

The Hereditary Grand Master of the Royal Order is the King of Scots, which position is at this time not filled. The Head of the Order and chairman of the Grand Lodge has the title of Deputy Grand Master and Governor. The honour is held today by Brother Ewan Rutherford. He presides over a network of 96 Provincial Grand Lodges around the world; five in Scotland and 33 in England, with the remaining spread across the rest of Europe, Canada, the US, Australasia, Africa, East Asia, and the Caribbean.

The Provincial Grand Lodge of Inverness and the Highlands was constituted in 1951, and meets at the Masonic Temple, Inverness, on the second Saturday of April, June, and September.

I raise men from darkness to light.


