At the twice monthly meetings, the Young Masons group enjoyed presentations on various masonic subjects, some of the presentations given by the members themselves, and many others from invited guests, from many parts of Scotland, and throughout the World, with interesting topics to be shared.

At the conclusion of the business part of the meeting Brother Alex Craib JD, gave a short but interesting history of Brother Lt. Col. Sir Hector Munro of Foulis the first Provincial Grand Master of the Province. Brother Craib covered all aspects of his life including both his Military and Masonic careers through to his passing at the age of 85 in 1935.

The Master thanked Alex for his well-presented paper. It was evident that he put a lot of research into the paper. The Brethren were well pleased with the paper and showed their appreciation in the customary manner.

On Saturday 28^{th} December, the Lodge tyled at 6:30pm for a Special meeting for my Re-Installation, for the fourth time. The Installation was carried out by Brother Ramsay McGhee PPGM of Ross and Cromarty, who was ably assisted by Brother Raymond MacKeddie, our current PGM and other PMs of Lodges within the Province. The degree was witnessed by 12 members and 19 visitors, collection amounted to £185, it was proposed that this figure be made up to £250, which goes to the Benevolent Fund of Grand Lodge.

At the Third rising I asked Brother Kevin Taggert IPM of Lodge Buchan St. John No. 636, to say a few words on behalf of the brethren out-with the Province and Brother Charlie Carrison RWM of Lodge Averon No. 866, to say a few words on behalf of the brethren with-in the Province. They both gave thanks for the honour and privilege of saying a few words and remarked favourably on the warmth of the welcome they received on entering the Lodge and the high standard of the Installation mentioning, Bro Morris Downie PPGM's, presentation of the Volume of the Sacred Law. Brother Gunn was warmly congratulated on being installed into the Chair of King Solomon for the fourth time. The business of the meeting being completed, the Lodge was closed in due and ancient form at 8:20pm.

On Tuesday 11th January the Lecture was given by Brother David Kinloch, our newly made Affiliate Member, on the subject of - "Brother Give Me Your Shoe". Well, David got going and soon got his own back for the Master press-ganging him to do a paper! He related the following stories before moving into the subject matter of his talk.

During the late 18th and 19th centuries, many attempts were made by captains of His Majesty's navy to enlist recruits for their sea-going warships to go to fight against the armadas of The Enemy. The notorious 'Press gangs' of the navy were the terrors of many seaside ports for often their methods were not as genteel and professional as they might be and many an unfortunate soul would wake up in the morning with a screaming hangover and or a badly bruised body to find himself far away from his friends, relations and home-land for an indefinite period.

Not so well known were the recruiting sergeants of the Scottish, and particularly, the Highland regiments, whose tactics often made the Navy seem like big 'Jessies'. One such was the Senior Recruiting sergeant of the Seaforth Highlanders, one Fergus Gunn. Whilst not possessed of great physical stature, Gunn was blessed with a silver tongue and a creative nature, and he had no difficulty in resorting to subterfuge, cunning and, when necessary, a wee chap on the heid with a night stick to maintain his position as the Regiment's leading and most prolific recruiter. Sergeant Fergus Gunn, recruiter and, where necessary, press gang leader extraordinaire was roundly admired by both his fellow recruiters and Officers of the Regiment alike for his undoubted and nefarious abilities. In due course and time, he retired gracefully to the Town of Dingwall where he went on to lead a blameless and quiet life with no reference to his previous, colourful, military career.

It is often said that his descendants have inherited his powers of silver-tongued persuasion supplemented, when necessary, by the ability to summon the ghosts of Fergus Gunn's press gang.

"Now this was the manner in former time concerning redeeming and concerning changing, for to confirm all things, a man plucked off his shoe and gave it to his neighbour".

It's been a tough couple of months here in Skye and Lochalsh with Covid cancelling one of our Meetings (January 2022), however we DID have a successful Meeting in December and another a week later for our Installation at which Brother Callum Mackenzie was re-installed in the Chair of King Solomon as RWM of Lodge Kyle 1117. We are now all looking forward to a First Degree at our February Meeting and to having a new Brother in our midst. Also looking good is our garden, thanks to the efforts of the brethren and especially Brother Paul Newton, who consistently braved the brutal breezes, brambles, and bugs only to find rhododendron roots underneath and that they in their own way, are even more pernicious than the brambles. The plan will be to grass over the newly vacant areas. We are also getting the old kitchen in the lodge replaced with a new one courtesy of Brothers Steve Whittaker and again Paul.

EMAIL - Over the past couple of years, we have seen an exponential increase in the use of email for Masonic communication. While this is an excellent way to save money and time, it brings its own attendant problems.

Firstly... the amount of email. As an IT professional I am regularly told... please keep your emails brief and only send me essential emails. In the past I have been accused of "bamboozling" customers by explaining in too much detail the nature of products and services, when they only want to know: What it is / How much it costs / When & Where can I get it.

Secondly ... We see email arrive with attachments, typically Word documents and PDFs. While this is handy for printing, but do all emails really need to come in two parts with huge images depicting a simple logo and contact details that cannot be copied and pasted? Also ... PDF and Word documents can harbour viruses, so think twice when sending them to all your members and other Lodge Secretaries, and ask yourself, "Is this really necessary? or will a simple text email suffice?".

Third... Consistency. Emails should be instantly recognisable as genuine. By making part of the SUBJECT of the email the same every time, you are (literally) sending a message to your recipient that the email is from the usual source and not a forgery. For example, I send all lodge correspondence with the SUBJECT as follows: - "secretary lodge kyle 1117: then the brief content description". The lower case is deliberate as it makes the recipients instantly aware that it's from their Lodge Secretary as its quirky and unlikely to be faked. You of course will have your own methods but be sure to be consistent.

Fourth... Spoofing and phishing. We are seeing more and more fake emails, and recently some that purport to be Masonic in nature. These can be openly Anti-Masonic in nature e.g. "Please help me get my relative out of the clutches of the Masons etc. Click here!!!" Or seemingly simple requests for information on a Masonic relative. While the request might be genuine; we need to check the provenance of these requests thoroughly before giving out possibly sensitive data about our members. We are also seeing an increase in Facebook "friend requests" from "cloned" Facebook pages. These are Fake Facebook pages with images of the real person lifted from the real page. To avoid getting caught out or "phished", simply contact your Friend and ask if they sent you a Friend Request.

Email security is a vast subject; however, I hope these few observations help evolve our missives into a standard email methodology and the way we deal with this essential tool.
