Editorial

Welcome to the 112th edition of the "Provincial Patter".

I am absolutely delighted with the way that the "Make it a Million" appeal is going both within the Province and literally throughout the world. The generosity of the brethren and their families is outstanding.

The creative and imaginative initiatives going on throughout the Scottish Constitution to raise funds for the vitally important work of Prostate Cancer Scotland is impressive.

At the last count, just prior to leaving for Australia and Fiji, we had reached £926,000. Day by day we are creeping closer – over the weekend just passed I received a cheque for £4000 from the PGM of Midlothian who has completed a virtual John O' Groat to Land's End walk. The new Master of Lodge St Andrew in Pitlochry gave me a cheque for £500.

We still have 25 places to take up on the zip-slide which I hope will realise at least £50k. Most Provinces have some initiative going and we have received generous donations from many of our Lodges abroad.

It must be stressed that the $\pounds 1,000,000$ given to Prostate Scotland will ultimately help men the world over and not just in Scotland.

The Ross and Cromarty Donation will be substantial and for that I convey my sincere thanks to you all.

Grand Lodge of Scotland



Since August last year when the Covid restrictions started to reduce and Lodge meetings were back on the agenda, Grand Lodge has attempted to pull three years of Provincial, District and Superintendency Installations and Lodge Rededications into one year.

We are succeeding and I hope that in terms of Installations, we will be fully up to date by the end of October. There are still several Lodge Rededications to be completed including one in this Province. However, with the co-operation of the Lodges, we hope to complete that programme early in the New Year.

During the period of the "Masonic Lockdown" over 2000 Scottish Freemasons have died – some from Covid, many from other causes. Irrespective of the cause, the families and the Brethren of the Lodges were unable to have proper fully attended funeral services.

Given that situation, Grand Lodge are holding a Service of Remembrance in Glasgow Cathedral on Sunday 4th September to remember all who have died at home and abroad during that period. Numbers in the Cathedral will be limited but each Province, in addition to the PGM, will be offered six places. The service will be televised live so that our Brethren around the world can join the service. The link to the service will be circulated to Lodge secretaries prior to the service.

I would encourage our Province of Ross and Cromarty to take up their allocated places for this historic and important service.

Provincial Grand Lodge:

It should now be holiday season, and we should be sitting relaxing with our feet up enjoying a nice cool......

Dream on, it has continued to be a busy period, despite most of the lodges now closed for the summer period.

Since I last wrote, at the start of May, we held our Lodge of Sorrow, the first to be held after a threeyear break due to the Covid Lockdown restrictions. The service, compassionately officiated by Rev. Iain Ramsden, Past Senior Grand Chaplain, was a very poignant and emotional event, due, firstly, to increased number of Brethren that passed to Grand Lodge above in the extended commemorative period, some 94 brethren failed to answer the call, and secondly, we admitted widows and families to the ceremony for the first time. It was also encouraging to see such a good representation from all the lodges in the Province present at the Lodge of Sorrow.

We have now completed all the Provincial Grand Lodge Annual Visits to the lodges in the Province. At the beginning May we travelled west to Lodge Kyle 1117 where we witnessed an excellent Master Mason Degree for Brother Whittle.

We returned to the west a couple of weeks later in the month to Lodge Loch Ewe 1551 and witnessed the tremendous work which the members have carried out on the building improvements, with a lowered ceiling in the lodge and more space created in the entrance area.

Towards the end of the month, with a good deputation of Provincial Office-bearers, we made the annual crossing of the Minch to Lodge Fortrose 108. We witnessed a very well worked Entered Apprentice Degree for Rhuaridh McLellan, the son of the well-known Bro. Graham McLellan.

The Brethren of the Province have responded magnificently to the Grand Lodge of Scotland appeal to assist in the Make it a Million, to support the Grand Lodge of Scotland's target to raise one million pounds for Prostate Scotland by November this year.

After a slight health scare during my first attempt at cycling around the Province which the medical experts assure had nothing to do with the cycling, I have now completed my cycle around the Province and visited each of the lodges en route, completing some 260 miles on the way.

It was very enjoyable to cycle around our Province and view such beautiful scenery that we have on our doorstep, and I can confirm the west coast hills are easier tackled in a car than they are on a bike.
