#### **Prostate Champion**

We are still looking for a volunteer to take on the role as a Prostate Champion for the East side of the Province. Due to our large geographical size, it is thought that we need two people to cover the role, one to cover the West and the other to cover the East. We currently have a volunteer in the West area.

The purpose of the Prostate Champions is to raise awareness of prostate disease in its various forms which is very prevalent in males over the age of fifty years and affects many of our Brethren. The raising of awareness will be achieved by the Prostate Champions speaking to Brethren, Lodges, Provincial Grand Lodges and distributing information literature. The Prostate Champions will be trained by Prostate Scotland via Zoom and will be provided with notes, lectures and probably PowerPoint presentations to assist them. Initially this outreach will be to the Brethren of the Craft but as things develop it is hoped that the Prostate Champions of the Scottish Craft will reach out to others within their communities to advance awareness and save lives as part of our community outreach.

Please also remember that prostate disease will affect, in the over fifty age group, one in two men may be affected by prostate disease and one in ten may develop prostate cancer. Early checking, diagnosis and treatment are key to improving the rates of cure.

The criteria for membership of the group are any member of the Craft under 45 years of age or having been a member of the Craft for no longer than seven years.

Due to the large geographical spread of our Province, and that we have many members who work away from home, it is anticipated that Zoom meetings will remain as part of the structure of the Young Masons Group.

## **BLAST FROM THE PAST - FROM - AUGUST 2005**

In the billet sent out by Lodge Secretary, Bro Keith Kauffman, he includes definitions of various Masonic terms as found in the Grand Lodge of NSW. They will no doubt be of interest to our own Brethren and may hopefully stimulate some discussion.

GAVEL: Derives its name from its shape-that of the gable or gavel end of a house. It is a tool used by a stonemason and resembles a hammer having a pointed end for cutting.

JEWELS, MOVABLE AND IMMOVABLE: The Movable jewels are the Rough and Perfect Ashlars and the Trestle Board and are so called because they are not confined to any particular part of the lodge whereas the Immovable jewels: the Square, Level, and Plumb, have definite locations. They are called "jewels" not because of their materials, but because of their meaning. The word "jewel" comes from the Greek meaning "bright or shining."

TRESTLE BOARD: The carpet or board upon which the Master inscribes the designs for guidance of the Craft. In the present day it refers to the meeting notice sent to the membership.

Some friends of the family have set up a "Gofund.me" page, "HELP HARPER BEAT RARE LEUKAEMIA". The page has been set up by their friend Tes Vapes, and Brother Owen, as you will see when opening the link below, where there is more information.

The target set for the fund is £4,000 which will be used to assist in travel costs for the 260-mile round trip to hospital and it is expected that the treatment she is receiving will take place over a two-and-a-half-year period involving lengthy stays in hospital. It is hoped to move nearer to the hospital, but a new home will need a new bespoke bed and other equipment for Harper while at home. The last 2 years has been a rough road for Bro Owen, losing his mother, his dad being seriously ill then losing savings to a con man. Now he is faced with fighting for Harper in the hope that she will come through what will be an incredibly tough time for her and indeed for the whole family. When a Brother in the Lodge passes, the Master rises, and calls for a minute's silence in which we remember him. A time for reflection and stillness. For seasoned Freemasons, something reverberates, connections to the ritual become more apparent, which can comfort, enlighten, and nourish us.

"What does Freemasonry give a man?" Perhaps the question should be, "What does it not?"

## **Province Grand Lodge of Inverness and the Highlands**

In Inverness Masonic Temple on Saturday, 10 June 2023, and at the third attempt, Bro Josh Gourlay was installed as the fourteenth Provincial Grand Master of the Province Grand Lodge of Inverness and the Highlands of The Royal Order of Scotland. He is the first Orcadian to have the honour to occupy the position.

Josh was appointed in February 2020 but his installation set for the following June was cancelled due to the pandemic. A second installation rescheduled for September 2022 was also called off due to the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

A small deputation of Grand Lodge of the Royal Order of Scotland travelled for the installation led by its Head, Bro Ewan Rutherford, and a good representation of other Provinces was evident from Aberdeen and Kincardine, Stirling and Perth, Carrick and Annandale, Cheshire, Cumberland and Westmorland, South Wales, and Preussen in Germany.

The Royal Order has ninety-four provinces worldwide and Inverness and the Highlands covers the geographic areas of Caithness, Eilean Siar, Inverness, Moray, Nairn, Orkney, Ross and Cromarty and Sutherland; draw a diagonal line from Macduff, through Grantown on Spey, Kingussie to Kinlochleven and anything north and west is covered by the Province.

The Province of Ross & Cromarty is well represented among the office bearers in the Royal Order Province with Bro Stephen J Smith, Immediate Past PGM, Bros Ramsay McGhee and Jim Tait, both Substitute PGMs, Bro Mike Turner, PG Secretary, Bro Stewart Hiddleston PG Banner-bearer, Bro Fred Fraser, Deputy PG Marischal and Bro George M Macleod, PG Guarder.

The Royal Order meets three times a year in Inverness on the Second Saturdays in April, June, and September. This has been reduced from four meetings as Josh is keen to hold at least one meeting per annum outside Inverness in other parts of the Province.
