Closing the Year

As year came to an end, it was very pleasing to reflect on what was a very successful year for the Province.

On the charity front, we started year setting a challenge to support MND Scotland, and the responses from the lodges was speedy and willing, and I was delighted to lead a group of representative Masters at a cheque handover event to the CEO of MND Scotland, Dr Jane Haley MBE, at Ross County Stadium where we ceremonially handed over a cheque to the value of £5,000.



The Province was also instrumental in adopting participation in the TLC Teddies for Loving Care (TLC) scheme, aiming to donate teddies to the A&E Departments in local hospitals to help assist children who find themselves in traumatic circumstances.

It was pleasing to gain the support of the neighbouring Provinces, with Caithness, Sutherland and Inverness-shire, collaborating with us to support the five A&E Departments in the Highlands and

Western Isles. It is very gratifying to witness the support from many lodges in raising necessary funding to support this worthy scheme, which I have no doubt will help to raise the profile of Freemasonry in the community.



Going forward we shall be looking at providing TLC teddies to other organisations including remote ambulance services, women's refuges and other children's support groups.



This leads nicely to our new initiative called Project '26. This is a major refurbishment of the hall with all Brethren being tasked with duties commensurate with their skill and fitness. There will be a reasonable budget available allowing us to paint the building, rebuild the kitchenette and a general sprucing up of the Hall. We also must do some fitting and installing work to keep our insurance up to date, but this is on-going.

Lastly a cautionary tale. As you know our Treasurer PM Brother Mick Moore passed to The Grand Lodge Above a few months ago, and we were fortunate indeed to have the very experienced Brother Roger Cundiff step into the breach. He contacted the bank (Bank of Scotland) to inform them that Mick Moore had died and that he was the replacement. A large form was filled in by Roger and myself, as I am the Secretary, and one of the two "Signatures" authorised to sign cheques and use the Bank Card. The form disappeared and Roger the Treasurer chased it up over the following weeks and months. As the forms contained personal information on us both, he posted them Recorded Delivery which means the delivery is photographed on arrival at its destination. However, the photo was not of the envelope Roger posted. He again contacted the bank to ask why this had happened and they said they would look into it. Finally, they located the forms but when Roger contacted them, they said as Roger was not a "signature", he would have to get an existing "signature" to verify him as being authorised to handle the Lodge's money. Fortunately, after several attempts I spoke to someone in the correct department who asked me many questions about the latest bank statement ... Suffice to say we managed to get Roger registered with the bank as a signature. In the future we will add a third signature to the account which in theory will allow for continuity in the event of someone dying. They story however (sadly) does not end there. We still had no access to internet banking and so over the following weeks Roger diligently worked with the bank to gain access to our account's internet banking. We can now see who has paid what and more importantly deduce who has NOT paid their dues, without waiting for the monthly statement in the post. A few days ago, we got a letter of apology from the bank accompanied by reasonable financial compensation for the form filing debacle.




